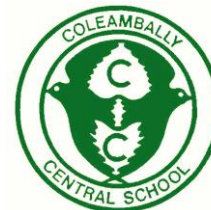

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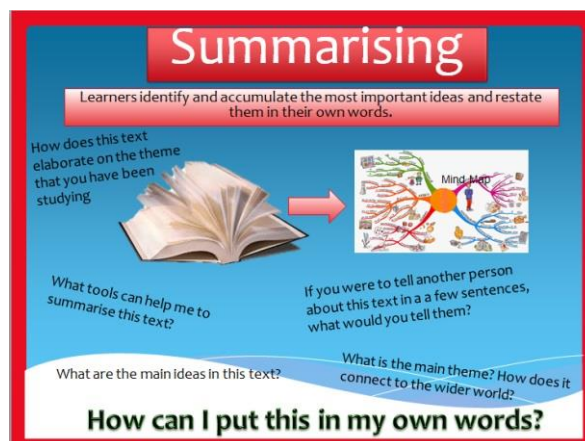

## Principal's Report

During week 9 we continue with our whole school literacy focus on our Super 7 strategy: **Summarising** to improve students understanding in Reading and Comprehension. A summary is a shortened version of a text that contains all the main points. Summarising is an important skill that helps when we are researching, gathering and presenting information. Finding key words or phrases help to summarise the text. These skills are essential for all students to gain a deeper understanding of what they are reading.
