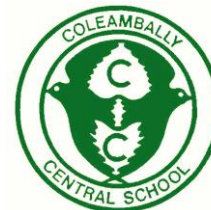

Literacy Strategies

We continue to focus on the core business of ensuring that our students continue to build on their understanding of the fundamentals of literacy. During Weeks 2-4 our whole school focus will be on the strategy of self-monitoring to improve reading and comprehension. Self-monitoring is being aware of your own thinking when you read. A really important part of self-monitoring is knowing when you have stopped understanding what you have read. It may be that you are not sure of what a word, sentence or even a paragraph means. This strategy provides the skills and
