Literacy Strategy of the week: Making Connections

Our literacy focus this final week of Term 3 continues to be **Making Connections**. **Making Connections** is when we make links between what we already know (our prior knowledge) and the text. There are three kinds of connections we can make. The first is called: Text to self-when we connect the text to our own experiences. The second, Text to text, occurs when we compare the text we are reading to other similar texts. These texts could be books or visual texts such as a movie or a TV program. Lastly, Text to world when we connect what we are reading to things that really happen in the outside world. Next term we will adopt the literacy strategy of **Inferring** to continue our focus on improving reading and comprehension.

Changes to the HSC for students entering Year 9 in 2017

The NSW government has announced that the NSW Higher School Certificate (HSC) will undergo wide-reaching reform to support all students achieving a *minimum standard of literacy and numeracy*, to reduce excessive student stress, to remove opportunities for plagiarism and pre-prepared responses, and to motivate and challenge students to achieve at their highest possible levels.

The BOSTES Board has determined that the *literacy and numeracy standard* will apply to Year 12 students completing the HSC from 2020. These students will be undertaking Year 9 NAPLAN in 2017, which will be the first opportunity to satisfy the standard. Any student who wishes to receive the HSC from 2020 will be required to meet the minimum standard.

What's the Standard?

Students can demonstrate they have met the standard by achieving:

a **Band 8 in each of their Year 9 NAPLAN reading, writing and numeracy tests**; or

a **pass in the online literacy and numeracy test in Years 10, 11 or 12**.

Students **who do not satisfy** the requirements for the HSC, including the **literacy and numeracy standard** will receive a **RoSA**.

Students have 5 years after leaving school to complete the requirements of the HSC including sitting the online numeracy and literacy test.
