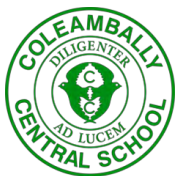

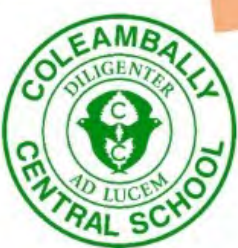

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# Year 8 STEM - Save Fred – Background

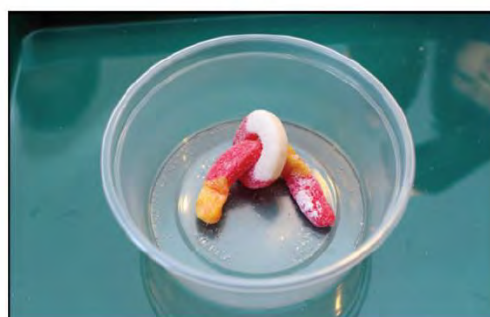
