Our School Canteen will continue to be closed on Tuesday and Thursday each week. Thank you to Kathy Hardy for keeping the canteen going and thank you to the parent volunteers who have given their time to help feed our hungry students. Please remember to prepare lunch for your child on Tuesdays and Thursdays and if there are any problems please call the school office. If you need to bring lunch or items to your child during the day you must come to the front office.

Bushfire Safety has been a focus during this term and we will be vigilant into 2024. In the event of a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating being declared for Coleambally Central School's NSW fire area, the Department of Education, in consultation with NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS), will direct the school to temporarily cease operations on those days and alternative learning arrangements will be put in place.

At approximately 4:00pm each day the Fire Danger Rating is issued for the following day. This means that our school will be notified after school hours that it will be non-operational the following day.

To ensure that we continue to support student learning on these days, I have put the following arrangements in place.

• We will inform our school community by SMS to the Primary Residential Guardian mobile phone contact of all students:



. After 4:00pm when the school is directed to temporarily cease operations the following day

. After 4:00pm to advise of the operational status of the school for the following day until normal operations resume

· Alternative learning will continue using Google Classroom during temporary cease of operations

 \cdot We will 'check-in' to support the learning and wellbeing of all students should temporary cease of operations continue for more than two days.

Schools may be made non-operational throughout the day due to changing risk conditions and the relevant advice from emergency services.

To assist the school in contacting all families please ensure that you have provided up-to-date contact details.

If you have old towels or sheets, these would support the school in preparation for emergencies requiring the school to shelter in place.

We are well prepared and hope we are planning for events that never take place.
